Looking Back at the 2017 HAPA National Conference

Working Together Para Seguir Adelante was the theme of the 2017 HAPA conference at the Strathallan's Century Club in Rochester. The conference provided an opportunity for HAPA members from across the country to come together. It was evident that many HAPA members have made significant moves across Xerox in the past few years, but there are still opportunities to seguir adelante (or move forward and advance). And working together is key to sustaining and building on all that HAPA members have achieved.

As always, this year's conference offered opportunities to learn, network and have fun. The one minor difference – everything we offered in a two-day conference was packed into one day. And it was a success! This would not have been possible without the help of the planning committee.

Our non-stop full day's-worth of activities was kicked off with a energy-boosting breakfast and motivating messages from Liz Vega (HAPA National President) and Andrew Copley (HAPA Corporate Champion). Liz also presented Darren Cassidy with the HAPA Champion Award. This was followed by a message from Beverly Stallings-Johnson, senior leader of Diversity and Inclusion: The importance of diversity and inclusion at Xerox - current and future outlook.

Networking is key to personal and professional advancement. Therefore, this was the focus of the two professional development workshops. **Networking 3.0** was presented by Hannah Morgan, job search and social media strategist. This was a 2-part interactive workshop that emphasized the importance of upgrading your networking skills and tools beyond the standard resume and elevator speech. The final workshop of the day, **Speed Networking**, presented by former XeroidMelissa Joyce-Rosen. This was a fun and challenging workshop that got everyone out of their seats and provided an opportunity for HAPA members to practice the networking skills they learned earlier on in the day. The second panel was later in the afternoon and included senior executives Darren Cassidy, Julie Hogan, Rick Schmachtenberg and Flor Colon. Thanks to our moderators for asking very insightful questions that allowed us to get up close and personal with the panelists and gain helpful tips on professional and personal development.

One of the biggest challenges of the conferences was how to top the previous years' final workshop of the day - wine and chocolate tasting in 2015 and the craft beer tasting in 2016. This year Nota Leon, HAPA's renowned tequila expert, led us on an entertaining and educational tasting history of tequila.

The conference ended with the evening with dinner and dancing at the rooftop ballroom, which offered a beautiful view of the city. Dinner included the presentation of HAPA awards to Edith Perez (HAPA Leadership Award) and Maria Nicolay (Adelante Award) and Scholarship awards to three deserving Hispanic students. 
